

Classical Charter Schools of America – Girls’ Uniform Requirements Updated 5/25/2023

For 2023-24, Kindergarten students will follow the new uniform policy while grades 1st-8th may have a year to phase in new requirements. Please visit ShopRBA.school for all your uniform needs, including French Toast brand uniforms that meet all criteria required, a new PE uniform, and approved outerwear.

Uniform Policy

Students are required to dress in the appropriate school uniform. High standards of decency, cleanliness and conservative grooming are expected at all times. Specific uniform requirements can be found below with links to ShopRBA.school for examples of acceptable uniform apparel. ~~including required footwear, types of clothing and colors can be found on the School’s website and in the administrative offices.~~ For identification purposes, it is highly suggested that students have their name inside each article of clothing. No manufacturer’s logo, trademark, or embroidery may be visible. Additionally, if a child's clothing is torn, dirty or not properly fitted, parents will be asked to replace the uniform. The Administration believes that these reasonable dress guidelines serve the School’s mission of providing a classical education by creating a traditional learning environment that promotes the values of the community of parents who have chosen to send their children to the School. Please find the grooming standards and uniform requirements below:

Girls: Grooming Standards

- May wear single stud and small earrings that are no longer than ½ inch (no more than ~~2~~two per ear). No facial piercings allowed.
- Small, non-eccentric necklaces and bracelets may be worn. Not more than one necklace and one bracelet.
- Watches may be worn. Smart watches may not be used during school hours and must be removed during standardized testing.
- Distracting, extreme, radical, or faddish haircuts, hair styles, and colors are not allowed.
- Make-up is not allowed for elementary students; middle school girls may wear conservative make-up.

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Boys: Grooming Standards

No jewelry or decorative objects are allowed including no facial piercing.

- Watches may be worn. Smart watches may not be used during school hours and must be removed during standardized testing.
- Hair must be **neatly trimmed clean** and off the collar, above the eyebrows, not below the top of the ears or eyebrows, and not an excessive height
- Distracting, extreme, radical, or faddish haircuts, hair styles, and colors are not allowed.
- No mustache or beards. Boys must be clean shaven.
